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Suitable Peer Learners To Collaborate With Contextual Recommenders

Abstract

If a contextual recommender is able to detect people nearby who are working on similar learning activities, the system can suggest suitable peer learners to collaborate with. For example, if a learner is being recommended material to study the theory of relativity while commuting from work to school using a smartphone, short, audiovisual material that fits the screen of the smartphone should be more relevant than a long, text-only document. Accordingly, the recommender system should rank the short videos higher than the long documents. This reranking of the recommended resources is not possible if the system does not know about the context of the user.
